#### **Election of Officers and Committee**

The President, Elizabeth Lady Hamilton, Vice-President Mr Peter Gregory-Hood, Vice-Chairman Dr. John Wilmot, Secretary Dr. Ruth Barbour, Treasurer and Programme Secretary Mr Neville Usher, Membership Secretary Mrs Gill Ashley-Smith were re-elected.

Dr. John Bland was elected Chairman for a three-year term. Dr. Sylvia Pinches was elected editor.

The following members of the Committee were re-elected: Dr Nat Alcock, Mrs Jane Beevers, Mrs. Jackie Bland, Dr. Maureen Harris, Dr Christine Hodgetts, Prof. Beat Kümin, Miss Monica Ory. Dr. Bob Bearman, Mrs Lesley Caine and Mrs. Christine Woodland were elected to the committee following their retirement from officer positions. Mr. David Paterson was elected to the committee for the first time. It was noted that the committee wished to continue to co-opt Miss Mairi MacDonald to the Committee.

The Accounts for 2015 were accepted.

The President made a presentation of books to Dr. Bearman to thank him for his incredible service to the society as editor of *Warwickshire History* for 45 years. Mrs Caine, retiring joint-chairman received a flower bouquet. A similar presentation was made to her co-chairman Mrs Woodland at the following evening meeting.

There being no other business the AGM finished at 7:45pm.

#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE FOR 2016

The society had a busy 2016 with a diverse range of events including the usual range of lectures and visits, a whole day conference for our society members and attendance with a stand at various 'history' events.

## Getting Online for Research and Publicity' Warwick School, 12<sup>th</sup> November 2016

This was the third 'umbrella' conference run by the society for its local history society members – 23 of whom were represented on the day. The aim was to discuss both the internet's potential for local history research and its use by societies for publicising their interests and activities.

In his keynote address Professor Beat Kümin from Warwick University introduced the Parish Research Network (my-parish.org) as an example of an online history source.

The morning session dealt with online sources. David Hodgkinson, archivist, described the Warwick County Record Office (WCRO) online catalogue as well as free resources available through computers located at WCRO and in the county libraries. Three experienced researchers, Bob Bearman, Nat Alcock and Stephen Roberts, explored the potential of on-line catalogues of other local archives and thematic websites.

The afternoon was devoted to the use of society websites for communication and publicity. Dr Jan Broadway, both historian and website developer, spoke on setting up websites. This was followed by presentations from John Alexander-Head, Bidford & District History Society; Margaret Rushton and Mick Jeffs, Leamington History Group and Lynda Greasley, The Bedworth Society, on their experience with society websites. All found that the websites aided recruitment and became the main communication channel with members and others. In discussion, the use of social media, especially Facebook could help to reach a younger group of potential members. Sam Collenette, Warwickshire Heritage & Culture, concluded the day by describing the website *Our Warwickshire*, a project in which WLHS has been involved.

**Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> December 2016** Our Christmas festivities took place at Upton House (NT) with an exhibition showing the house converted to become the headquarters of the Samuel Merchant Bank during the Second World War. Afternoon tea was followed by a musical interlude including wartime songs. John Bland was the master of ceremonies as well as accompanying the singers on the piano.

The executive committee met on three occasions and sub-committees dealing with publicity and the organisation of the umbrella conference also met.

#### Outreach/co-operation with other organisations

The society has taken a stall at the following events: Stratford upon Avon Book Fair (January and August), Writers in Warwickshire at Astley, Leamington History Day and Warwick Words History Society Fair.

The society was officially represented at the relaunch of the *Our Warwickshire* Website and John Bland and Christine Woodland have continued their considerable input into this project on behalf of the society.

Two issues of *Warwickshire History* were published during the year. The first, Volume XVI, Number 4 was the last to be edited by Bob Bearman and contained the winning essays from our 50<sup>th</sup> birthday competition (2015):
